WEEK ELEVEN

What We've Practiced This Week

Reading: This week we learned the letter L (*eh-lay*) and practiced reading words with the syllables *la-le-li-lo-lu*. We also practiced reading the words "dónde" (where) and "está" (is) as sight words. Besides this, we read several stories as a class about farm animals and practiced drawing conclusions from the story-using clues from the story to figure out something that the author didn't tell us directly in his or her words.

Math: In math this week, we talked about different objects' length and weight. We practiced determining which object was the longest, shortest, heaviest, and lightest of a group.

Writing: This week we practiced writing sentences about farm animals that we like. We learned how to use the phrases, "Me gusta," and "Me gustan." We also practiced starting each sentence with a capital letter, using lowercase letters in the sentence, leaving spaces between words, and ending with a period.

Thanksgiving Theme: We began our Thanksgiving theme this week by reading about the pilgrims and why they were thankful. As the week continued, we talked about things for which we are thankful. We also learned about turkeys! We pretended to be turkeys as we learned about the different parts of a turkey's body, labeled a turkey, and learned different fun facts about turkeys. We're excited to learn more next week!
