
Next week students will participate in engaging holiday activities and will also learn about the difference between needs and wants.

What We've Practiced This Week

<u>Reading</u>: Instead of focusing on a single letter this week, we practiced reading syllables that end in –l or –s. We talked about words that contain a syllable ending in one of these letters and practiced hearing if the syllable came at the beginning or the end of a word. It was a bit of a challenge, but we practiced very hard until we became really good at it! We also practiced the words *los* and *nosotros* and read books about the weather, which gave us a chance to discuss different types of weather.

<u>Math</u>: This week, we continued to compare two groups of objects using the words *más* and *menos* (more and less/ fewer). Once we decided if one group had more or fewer objects, we decided what needed to be done to make the groups have the same number of objects. We also practiced explaining our thinking!

Writing: This week we learned many weather words and wrote about the weather using what we learned. We enjoyed writing about different types of weather and illustrating our books!

Reindeer Theme: We had a blast learning about reindeer this week. To start, we read all about reindeer, also called caribou, that live in the wild. We learned what they can do, what they eat, and what their different body parts are called. Later in the week, we read a silly story about a reindeer that can read, drive, and teach, just like a person! Maestra Douglas
