Next Week

Reading:

Letter Dd (*day*). Syllables *da-de-di-do-du*. Identifying final syllables in words. Words *muy* (very) and *por* (for/by). Discussing a story's setting.

Math:

Comparing objects' sizes. Describing things that occur <u>before</u> and <u>after</u> an event. Describing an object's location, (e.g. next to, under, over).

WEEK SEVENTEEN

What We've Practiced This Week

Reading: This week, we learned the letter Gg, which is one of the most difficult letters in the Spanish alphabet! We focused on the syllables ga, go, gu, which make the hard Gg sound (as in gato, goma, and gusano). We also learned that Gg makes a softer sound in the syllables ge and gi, similar to the letter Hh in English. Besides this letter practice, we learned the sight words $qu\acute{e}$ and es and practiced drawing conclusions while reading stories.

Writing: This week during writing time we learned how to use exclamation marks to show emotion and excitement as we write. We learned that in Spanish we need to place an upside-down exclamation mark at the beginning of a sentence and a regular exclamation mark at the end. To practice using exclamation marks, we wrote about our favorite kind of weather.

<u>Penguin Theme</u>: We continued to focus on penguins this week, learning more about penguins through informational and fictional text. First, we read about what penguins can do, like sliding, jumping, waddling, and diving. We also reviewed our learning by completing a graphic organizer. We then read about Tacky, another silly penguin, and wrote a class book about a very talented penguin.

Evaluations: This week was extremely busy as we worked on finishing individual report card testing with each student. Our kindergarteners were eager to show what they have learned!
