What We've Practiced This Week


Reading: Our focus letter this week was Qq and the syllables *que* and *qui*. These two syllables are tricky because the Uu is silent in the syllables. (They are pronounced *kay* and *key*). We took times this week to practice reading these syllables in words and remembering to keep the U silent. Besides our letter work, we learned to read the word *gracias* and practiced using it in sentences. We also read several stories about different jobs and discussed what the main idea of each story was.

<u>Math</u>: During math this week, we practiced comparing sets of objects with between 0 and 20 items. We learned how to compare the sets by matching the objects and by using a number train.

Writing: This week, students were assigned a small group and chose a job to research and write about. Monday and Tuesday were spent researching the job and brainstorming ideas that could be added to their very own informational books. Students worked together to write an introductory sentence for their book and began to add content, writing specific information about the job they had chosen. We hope to wrap up our books next week!

Theme Time: We spent our theme time this week completing St. Patrick's Day themed games and activities. We talked about leprechauns, pots of gold, and rainbows. We also discussed what we would do with a pot of gold if we found one! **Maestra Douglas**
